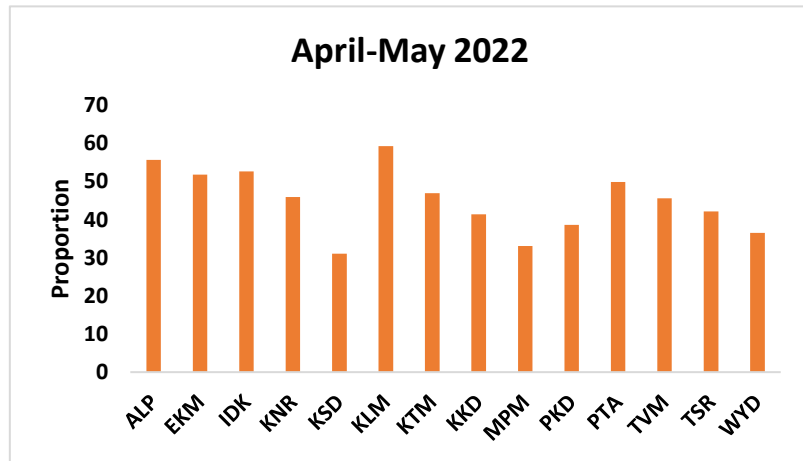
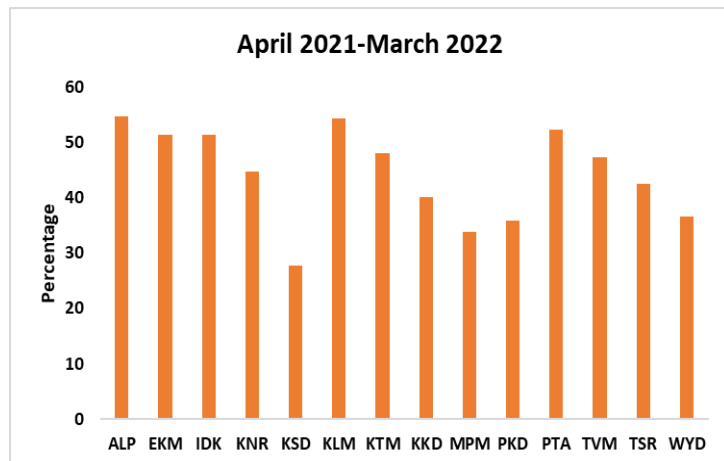

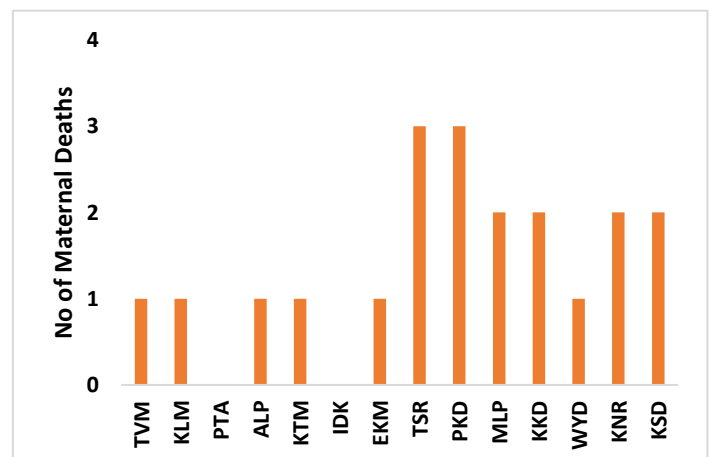
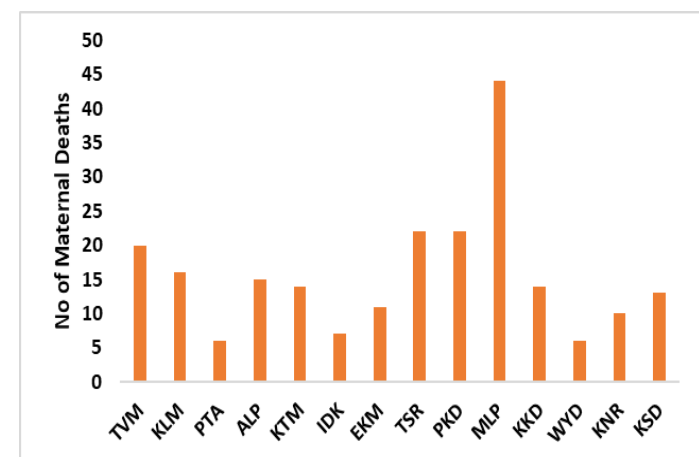
3. % of C-Section performed out of total institution delivery

#### ACHIEVEMENTS & CHALLENGES

##### Achievements



Consultations through MLSP and Palliative care Nurses started.  
Kerala crossed 26,000 consultations in doctor to doctor consultation and 4 Lakh consultations in eSanjeevani OPD.  
Procurements have begun for the launch eSanjeevani in Thiruvananthapuram open jail.  
Four Medical Colleges started eSanjeevani HWC consultations.

##### Challenges



As a result of the KGMO strike, many Spoke did not conduct consultations in the eSanjeevani HWC Platform.  
Doctor to Doctor consultation is conducted only from four Medical College and the rest have not yet started consultation.  
SMD issues DO letter for the UPHCs with zero consultation.  
GOI has strongly instructed to do a minimum consultation from all registered spoke profiles and list out the registered spokes with zero consultation.  
Some UPHCs and MLSPs do not conduct doctor-to-doctor consultation.  
District hub is established only in eight districts and the rest have not yet started District HUB.  
Idukki, Kannur, Kasaragod Palakkad, and Thrissur are not showing improvement in Sanjeevani HWC consultation.  
Many of the eSanjeevani telemedicine specialty OPDs is now vacant owing to the doctors' strike. As a result, many beneficiaries are being veered away from eSanjeevani's specialty telemedicine op services.

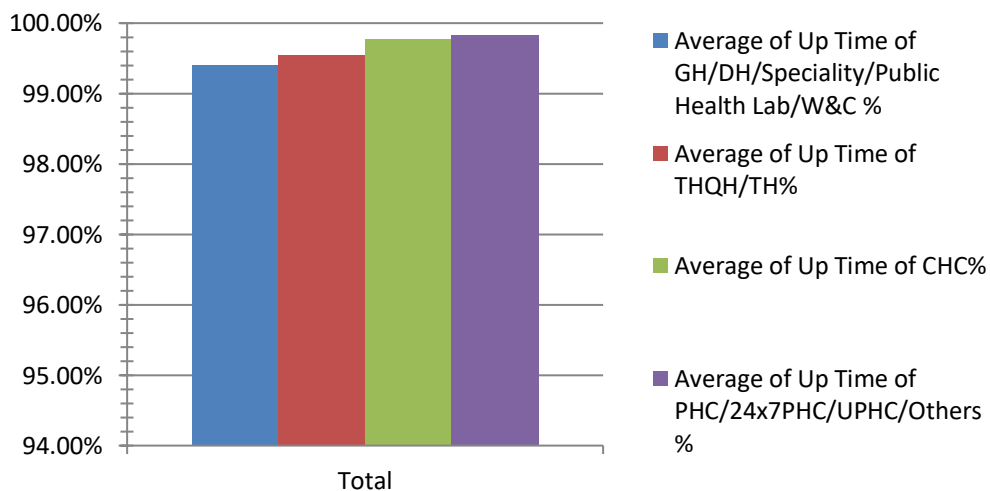
Total Number of Assets -Distriwise

Facilitywise Up time -Average (%)





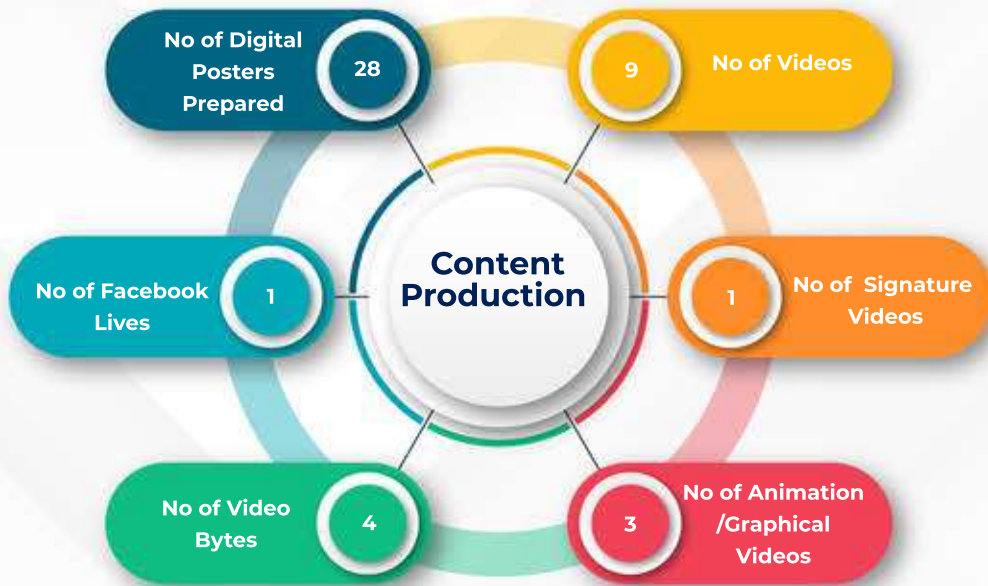

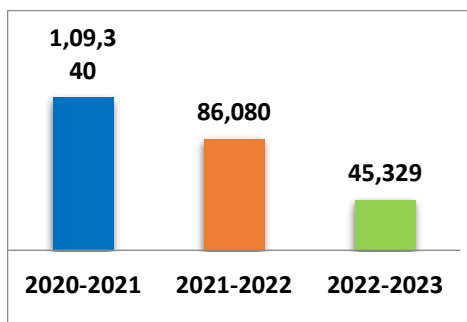

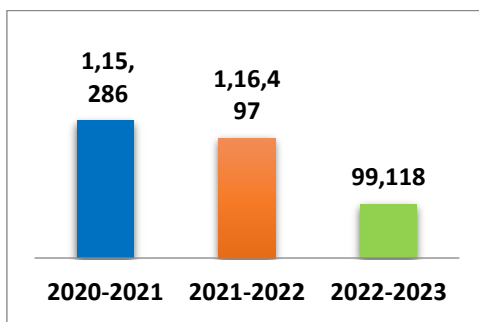

Number of Eligible Couples Registered in RCH Portal During April to June



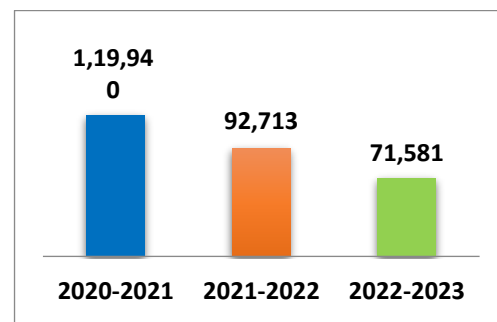

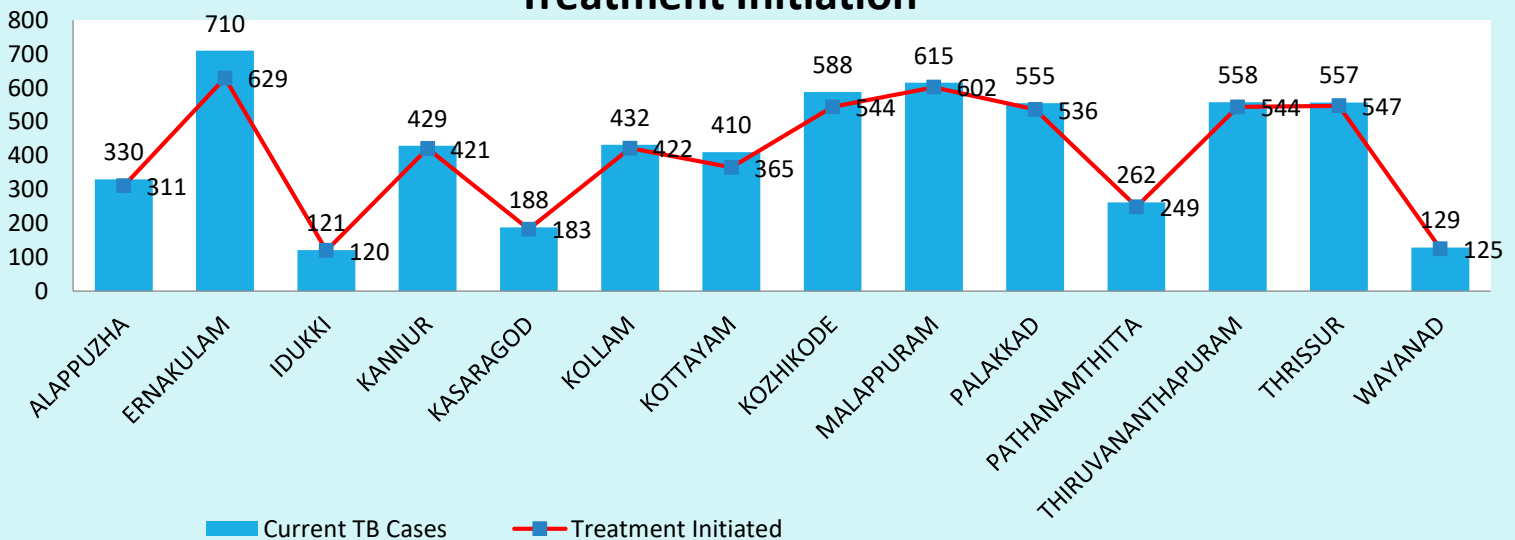

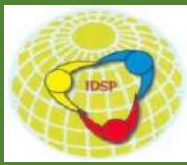


#### TB Treatment

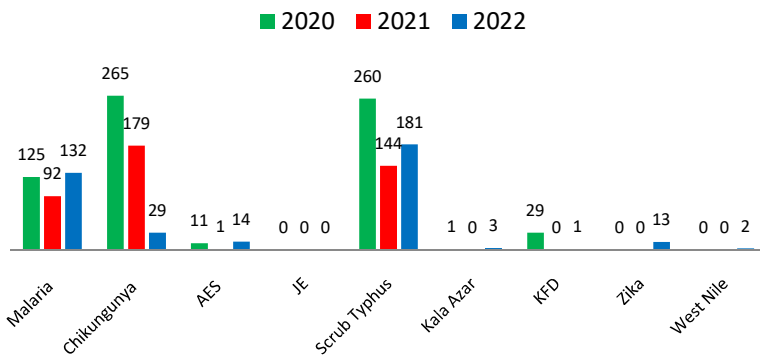

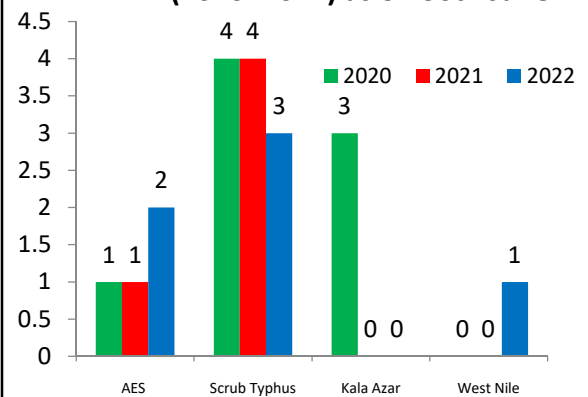

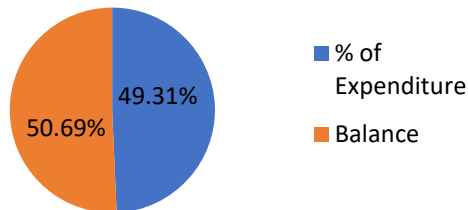

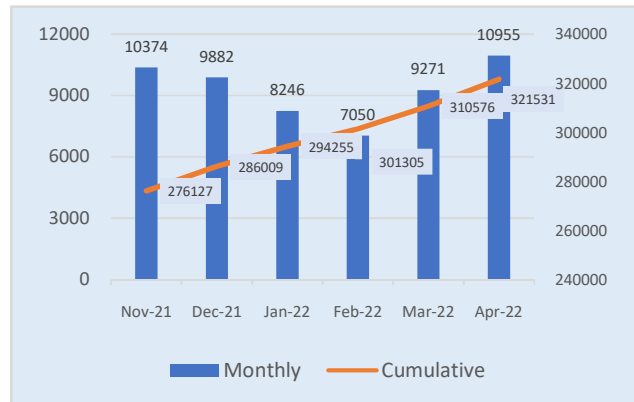
